sussex County successfully applied for a \$1,326,172 grant for this project through the NJTPA's 2013 High Risk Rural Roads Program. The project will implement a series of safety in two areas: Tuttles Corner-Dingmans Road (CR 560) from Route 206 to the Dingmans Bridge in Sandyston; and a 4-mile segment of CR 519 extending approximately from North Park Drive in Newton to just north of Morris Turnpike in Frankford.

Project Details

Improvements will include anti-skid road treatments, new signs, high-visibility pavement markings upgrades, and guide rail upgrades at key locations throughout the corridors.

About the Project Area

Both of these roadways are curving rural corridors that exhibited crash rates above state averages according to 2009-11 data.
