Meadowlands Parkway Bridge

**Funding awarded:
\$500,000**

Hudson County successfully applied for a \$500,000 grant for this project through the NJTPA's Fiscal Year 2019 Local Capital Project Delivery Program. This project will investigate options for replacing or rehabilitating the Meadowlands Parkway Bridge in the Town of Secaucus.

Project Details

This project will study replacing or rehabilitating the four-lane, four-span bridge, which was built in 1973 and has a series of parallel steel beams supporting the deck. The bridge, which is 316 feet long, carries traffic over Norfolk Southern rail lines. It is classified as structurally deficient and functionally obsolete. The Town of Secaucus in conjunction with the New Jersey Department of Transportation has undertaken more than \$3 million in temporary structural repairs to the bridge.

About the Project Area

The Meadowlands Parkway Bridge connects an industrial and commercial area in Secaucus to the New Jersey Turnpike, Frank R. Lautenberg NJ TRANSIT Station and State Route 3. This important arterial roadway is highly trafficked.

The Local Capital Project Delivery Program

The NJTPA's Local Capital Project Delivery Program awards grants to counties and cities to investigate all aspects of a project, including environmental, right of way access, design and feasibility issues. Projects that complete this initial investigative work, called the Local Concept Development Phase, may be eligible for eventual construction with federal funds.
