What is GMSC?

Goods Movement is an engagement tool for freight practitioners and public stakeholders to learn and discuss the community impacts of freight and best practices for remediation





Stakeholders & the Region

We are all affected by freight movement

- ... Especially in the NJTPA region
- Dense population
- High industrial concentration
- Massive shipping facilities





Issues

Some of those impacts include:

- Parking challenges
- Traffic congestion
- Pavement/bridge wear
- •Noise impacts
- Safety conflicts





Strategies

Strategies to address these issues include:

- Curb space regulations
- Truck access controls
- Noise reduction





Purpose of the tool

Bring together a wide range of stakeholders for informed conversations about freight, using a common framework of issues and strategies



Tool Access

It is available in desktop web browsers and in mobile browsers

The tool steps users through a process to identify an issue and returns applicable strategies

Development Process

- 1) Requirements gathering
- 2) Code and data development
- 3) Design and graphics
- 4) Testing





Data



- Two key data types: Issues and Strategies
- 21 specific Issues
- 34 Strategies organized into 10 groups
- Each strategy has its own report for further info



Data



Data was gathered from literature reviews:

- National/state/local project reports and studies
- Academic papers
- Transportation research institution websites



Development



Development was iterative:

- Meetings between developer and product owners once every two weeks to clarify approach
- Milestone meetings withCommunications to clarifylanguage and overall message



Design



- Wizard design: user completes steps in a specific sequence
- Image-heavy: show examples of the issues and strategies
- Incorporates user-friendly graphics



Testing



- Internal beta testing with freight, communications, and planning tools staff
- External beta testing with select members from the freight planning community
