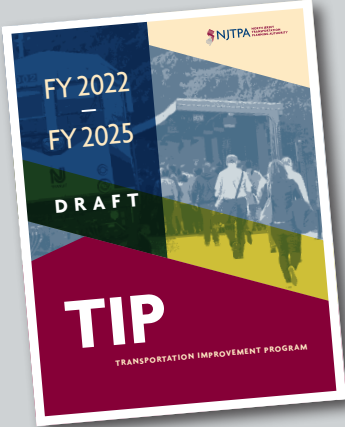


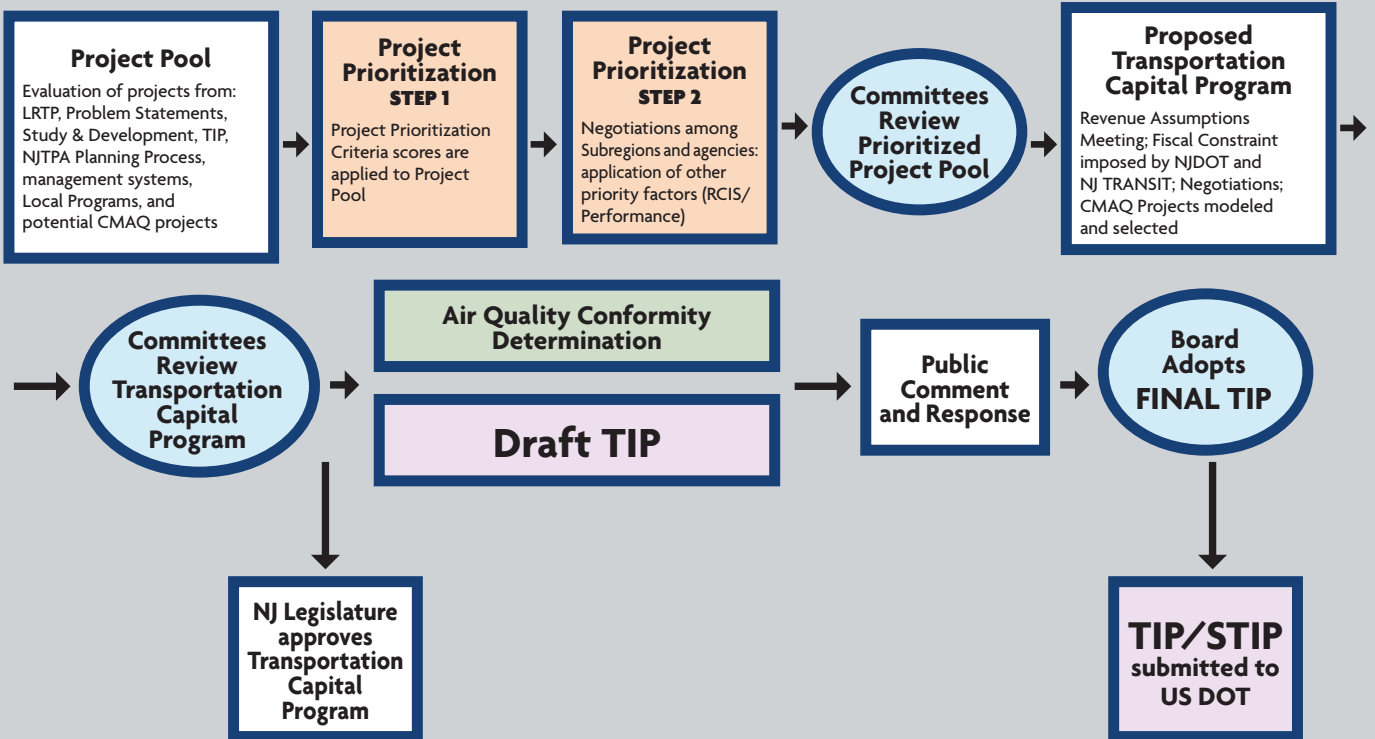
Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

What is the TIP?



- The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) lists all projects for which federal and non-federal funds will be spent.
- The TIP covers four years and is developed every other year.
- The TIP includes public transit, road, bicycle, pedestrian and freight-related projects.
- By the time a project has reached the TIP, it is in its final stages of the Project Pipeline:
Preliminary Engineering → Final Design → Right of Way → Construction.
- The TIP does more than simply list projects—it spells out the anticipated cost and funding schedule for each phase of the project.

TIP Development Process



- The TIP approval process typically takes one year to complete.
- The NJTPA Board adopts the Final TIP after the Public Comment period.

Draft FY 2022-2025 TIP

- In FY 2022, \$3.12 billion program—\$1.77 billion for NJDOT and \$1.35 billion for NJ TRANSIT.
- In FY 2022, 48.7% federal funding and 51.3% state and other funding.
- 273 projects and programs—231 from NJDOT and 42 from NJ TRANSIT programmed in 2022-2031.
- 68.6% for Road & Transit Preservation and Enhancement; 18.9% for Bridges.
